<b>2</b> .	Four years of farm/ranch management experience or equivalent (as approved by the ASFMRA). Experience must have been completed within the last ten years. One year experience is a calendar year during which a person spends not less than 1,600 hours as follows: at least 600 hours of the 1,600 must be spent managing rural property for a fee or a salary. The balance must be spent in a field related to farm/ranch management. Any prior or equivalent experience should be submitted for review very early in the accreditation process so the ASFMRA can determine if the experience qualifies.	<ul> <li>A. Written examination is proctored and given at Education Week each year and takes approximately 12 hours to complete. The written exam includes: <ol> <li>Case Study Problems</li> <li>Multiple Choice</li> <li>True-False</li> </ol> </li> <li>B. Oral interviews covering any or all phases of the applicant's knowledge and experience.</li> <li>The Awarding of the Designation <ol> <li>The newly accredited are notified that they can use their designation upon receipt of the letter that they have passed. □ 3.	A four-year college degree or equivalent (as approved by the ASFMRA). Any equivalent education should be submitted for review very early in the accreditation process so the ASFMRA can determine if the equivalent education qualifies.	
<b>4</b> .	Be a current ASFMRA application for accreditation.	membership and abide by all membership requirements. Please contact ASFMRA for more detailed information.
<b>□</b> 5.	Electronically submit one farm management plan demonstrating the ability of the applicant to produce management plans according to the standards of ASFMRA. The plan will be graded and must garner a score of at least 75 percent overall score as well as score 70% or higher in each subcategory. A passing score can qualify, as a component of the AFM accreditation process, for three years from the	Every three (3) year period, accredited members of ASFMRA must have a minimum of sixty (60) hours of approved programs submitted for the Continuing Education Program to maintain the accredited status.
